




#### Running Start Information

Running Start provides academically motivated students an opportunity to take college courses as part of their high school education. Students may take just one class per quarter, or take all of their courses on the Clark College campus, earning both high school and college credit for all completed courses.

Students planning to begin Running Start in Winter 2022 can attend a **Virtual Running Start**Information Session for enrollment information. For help getting started today, email start@clark.edu or enroll@clark.edu and/or call 360.992.2107.

#### To qualify for Running Start:

- You must be a Junior or Senior as determined by your high school and/or school district.
- You must be currently enrolled in a Washington State public high school.
- If you are home schooled, or a in a private school, you will need to enroll in your neighbor-hood public high school as "intent to home school".
- You can participate in Running Start for three terms as a Junior and three terms as a Senior.
   Students must apply to the college.

#### **SCHOOL CLOSURES & LATE STARTS**



When inclement weather occurs, it may be necessary to implement a two-hour late start, snow bus routes, or a school closure. Student safety is our primary concern when making these decisions. *Please use your discretion.* Even if a school is open, parents and guardians may use their own judgment whether it is safe to send their children to school. Weather-related absences are excused when reported to the school by a parent or guardian.

#### **Late Starts:**

In the event of a late start, school begins two hours later than normal. If a weather-related, two-hour late start occurs on a **Wednesday Late Start day**, the teacher collaboration time will be canceled and school will start two hours later than the regular (Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri) start time.

#### Apprentice to Become an Electrician

An electrical <u>APPRENTICE</u> is someone who is learning the electrical trade while supervised on the job and through related classrooms instruction. Once accepted into our apprenticeship program, we will provide you with two weeks of Basic Skills training. We will then place you with an employer and you will earn wages, health care benefits, and retirement benefits.

Pre-Apprenticeships expose students to different building trades and help students become familiar with terminology, hand and power tool use, job expectations, construction safety, and more.


