## AMERICAN INDIAN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) will accept applications for the 2022-23 American Indian Endowed Scholarship (AIES) from December 2021 through March 1, 2022. Applications must be postmarked by March 1, 2022. Applications must be accompanied with all required attachments.

The American Indian Endowed Scholarship (AIES) helps financially needy students with close social and cultural ties to an American Indian community in the state of Washington. Students can use the scholarships at public colleges and many independent colleges in Washington. The program prioritizes upper division and graduate level students, however, all applicants receive award consideration.

Award amounts range from around \$500 to \$2,000. About 15 students are selected each year to receive the awards. Students may get AIES funding for up to five years, but they must reapply each year.

Many past recipients have careers in law, medicine, education, business, and resource management. All have returned, or plan to return, to their tribal communities to work on behalf of Indian peoples within the state.



#### **Pre-Apprenticeship and Training Programs**

What is Pre-Apprenticeship? Pre-apprenticeship is a program or set of services designed to prepare individuals to enter and succeed in a Registered Apprenticeship program. Although a pre-apprenticeship can be helpful, it's not required (and often not necessary) to become a registered apprentice. Pre-apprenticeships may be a good fit for individuals who:

- Have little or no experience in the construction trade
- Experience barriers to employment
- Need to improve their math skills
- Need assistance obtaining supplies or equipment























# ROADBLOCKS/ SOLUTIONS

#### Physical Exam:

We are offering physical exams (Medical pages 1-6) during Onsite Assessment January 3-6. Any youth that cannot get a physical before January 1<sup>St</sup>, can get their physical exam completed on our campus. This opportunity removes an enormous roadblock for youth and families.

Immunization Record from the doctor's office:
We can use a copy of the immunization from the school.

#### Dental Exam:

This can be waived if youth is unable to secure an appointment before January 1<sup>ST</sup>.

Release of Liability with Notary Signature:

We will have a notary available at Onsite Assessment to assist parents with this document.

Missing Social Security Card, Birth Certificate, WA ID: We can accept a copy of the application for items and get acopy when the document when it arrives. Any form of picture ID will beaccepted.

Criminal History Background Check:

If there is a financial need, we can pay for this backgroundcheck

Transcripts: Unofficial is just fine

These documents need to secured before Winter break. They provide proof of credit deficiency and eligibly.


